Part B. CV SUMMARY (max. 3500 characters, including spaces)

In my academic career I have followed two successive lines of research. In the first one I was strongly influenced by contemporary french thought, and it was focused on the study of Renaissance skepticism and the rise of modern subjectivity (with much emphasis on the *Essais* of Michel de Montaigne). In the course of this research, I was a visiting PhD student at the Universities of Paris IV-Sorbonne and Chicago, and I published two monographs, (2005a and 2007) and more than twenty papers in Spanish, French and English.

Even if I still work occasionally on that line of research, in recent years I have focussed on the second one of the aforementioned lines, approaching the same set of philosophical challenges with a systematic and analytical methodology, contributing to various ongoing debates in epistemology (epistemic luck and risk, virtue epistemology, knowledge-how), philosophy of language (pragmatics, speech acts theory) and action theory (intentional action, achievements). While working on those topics, I have held visiting positions at universities such as Berkeley (2005), Duke (2006), Oxford (Wolfson College, 2009/10), Edinburgh (2013, 2015, and 2016), NYU (2019) and Glasgow (2022). Results of this second line of research have been articles in journals such as *Philosophy and Phenomenological Research* (Q1), *Synthese* (Q1), *Metaphilosophy* (Q1), *Pragmatics & Cognition* (Q2), or *Erkenntnis* (Q1).



Linking these two lines of work has been been a personal intellectual adventure, and as a result of it I produced what I consider my most relevant contribution so far: *How to do philosophy with words: reflections on the Searle-Derrida debate*. A revised version of this monograph, originally published in Spanish by Fondo de Cultura Económica (2010), was published in English by John Benjamins (2017).

Along these years, I have also carried on intense undergraduate and graduate teaching, I have been Vice-Dean on different occasions, and I have been editor in different journals and on line resources. Regarding funding, I have been a research member in 5 different national research projects and co-Principal Investigator in one of them (2019-2022).
